It is with pleasure I advise that following a rigorous and extensive recruitment process to find the next Head of College of Moreton Bay College, the mission is now complete!

In recent days a contract has been signed with Ms Jennifer (Jenny) Winn to assume the role of Head of College for MBC effective from 4 January 2016.

Ms Winn is currently Director of Teaching & Learning, St Peter's Lutheran College, Brisbane. Jenny has been employed at St Peter's Lutheran since 2001 in a number of roles including Acting Head of Senior School, International Baccalaureate Coordinator and Head of Curriculum and Pedagogy.

St Peters is a P-12 co-educational day and boarding college. It has three campuses, Indooroopilly P-12, Springfield P-12 and Ironbark (an outdoor education facility). Indooroopilly school has over 200 teaching staff and 2100 students. Springfield school has approximately 350 students and 30 teaching staff.

Ms Winn has led and managed all aspects of curriculum, assessment and reporting across all four sub-schools and all academic programs at Indooroopilly. In addition, she has supported and provided oversight of curriculum and pedagogy at Springfield. Ms Winn has had oversight of subject department and academic recurrent and capital budgets, provided advice to Head of College and College Council on strategic directions for curriculum and taken leadership for curriculum positions of added responsibility.

Other positions of responsibility which Ms Winn has held are as a panel member for Physics with Queensland Studies Authority (now QCAA) and is a present Education Committee Member of the Independent Education Union of Australia (QIEU).

The new Head of College holds a Master of Education degree from Deakin University, Graduate Diploma of Management (University of Central Queensland) and a Master of Human Resources Management (University of Central Queensland).

Ms Winn brings to the position, experience in managing human relationships to create a culture of collegiality, the development of a collaborative, open learning community, and the ability to lead others to develop exemplary teaching and learning strategies to advance student learning.

I am sure you will join me in congratulating Ms Winn on her appointment and welcome her to Moreton Bay College in 2016. A time will be arranged for Ms Winn to visit the College and have the opportunity to meet with staff later in the term.
